A MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD

I am a Minnesota native, but I am not a person who grew up in Duluth. When I arrived in 2013, I had very little knowledge of this city. I was "brought here" by my son who decided upon University of Minnesota Duluth as his college of choice. My family had spent the majority of our lives in Los Angeles and South America until we moved to our neighbor state of WI in 2005, but having come (back) to the Midwest, we were attracted to the rich and vibrant sense of place and the arts scene here in Duluth. My son came to study Musical Theater at UMD and

appeared in multiple Playhouse productions when they were still housed in the Depot Theater – this is how I came to know about the Depot and the Depot Foundation.

I was in awe of the building itself, and when I discovered the Lake Superior Railroad Museum, I was moved to tears to learn from one of the docents, that we have the train car that carried President Lincoln's body across the country after his assassination - restored and on display in the museum! Amazing!

Key attributes within any city include elements contributing to its social wealth. This term refers to all the elements that contribute to quality of life including an emphasis on the "caring" and "creative" economy. For example, quality education, healthcare, childcare, community networks and social supports, and family-friendly workplaces and of course, the arts. The social wealth of any community is often overlooked by folks focusing solely on easily measurable economic factors. How does one quantify the sense of historical identity that undergirds many of the community networks here in Duluth, or the impact of an arts scene that includes opera, an orchestra, dance, theater and visual arts? There are clever ways to capture some of these attributes with various metrics, but they are often messy and seem to miss some of the key points that inform the quality of life. Without social wealth, one cannot have economic wealth. Think of the elements required to support individuals and communities to live healthy, creative and cohesive social lives, working in partnership with each other and with the natural environment (which here in Duluth is another spectacular attribute) to improve living conditions for all...

In the years since I have called Duluth home, it has become clear that this is a city that enjoys a high level of social wealth. The Depot foundation is a key supporter of this social and creative wealth! I am honored to be able to serve on the board of this important foundation. The historic Depot itself coupled with the work of the historical society and the museum spaces within its walls emphasize the dynamic and unique history of this city and our region. It grounds what we do here today in a sense of place! Our work to support local artists and various creative endeavors and to make this work accessible to all our neighbors and friends deepens the social wealth of our region and beyond.

Good evening everyone! I am Isabella Blindauer. Along with Libby, I am both an apprentice with the Minnesota Ballet, and a senior in the School of the Minnesota Ballet, who received the Arts for All scholarship.

This scholarship has helped me in more ways than one. When I applied for the scholarship it was merely for some financial aid for the school, as ballet is getting more expensive for me and my family each year, with tuition, pointe and technique shoes, and all the other random expenses. But as the semester has

progressed, having earned the scholarship has helped me appreciate ballet even more than I already had.

I have been dancing for the past nine years, and luckily I have either had minor injuries, or ones during the off season. However, I recently got a concussion and have had to take a step back from dancing. In doing so I have realized just how much I love dancing and how hard it is for me to sit down, when all I want to do is turn and jump and build my strength. I remember one of the first days I had done some dancing after my concussion, and my head began to hurt so I went and sat down again and watched the rest of class. I got home that night and almost burst into tears. I felt weak and upset because ballet is the thing that takes me away from all other worries of the world, and I couldn't dance. Not really anyways. Luckily that only lasted a week before our spring break, and I am so grateful for all my friends, family, and teachers who are incredibly supportive and helpful.

Now this all ties back to the scholarship because, had I not had the scholarship, I don't think the year would have gone the way it has. I think I would have been more stressed, and maybe I would have pushed myself too hard to get better, as I would have thought of all the money that my injuries would have wasted. This scholarship has really helped me appreciate what I do, as it has helped me focus on just dancing, rather than having the thought of how much money my parents would be spending on me. I believe that having this scholarship has also helped me be more adamant on taking care of my injuries, so that I can heal quickly and get right back into dancing.

I am so grateful for having earned this scholarship, not only has it helped my family financially, but it has also helped me appreciate this art form even more. I would like to thank the Depot Foundation for not just the scholarship, but for believing in me. I would also like to give a thank you to all those who were there to support me and helped me get through this year, and my concussion, specifically my parents, Brett and Kelly Blindauer, all of my teachers, especially Mr. Karl, and all my friends, in ballet and out. Thank you all so much, and I hope you all enjoy the rest of your evening.

Consider making your Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) to The Depot Foundation

If you are 70 ½ or over, you can make a qualified charitable distribution to the Depot Foundation or satisfy your required minimum distribution (RMD) from your IRA. Each year, an IRA owner age 701/2 or over can exclude from gross income up to \$100,000 of these QCDs. For a married couple, if both spouses are age 70½ or over and both have IRAs, each spouse can exclude up to \$100,000 for a total of up to \$200,000 per year. Moreover, for those who are at least 73, QCDs count toward the IRA owner's required minimum distribution (RMD) for the year. Talk with your financial advisor to learn more. Thank you!
