

Sadly, donations by individuals in the United States has been dropping steadily. According to the Chronicle of Philanthropy, in 2024, over \$592 billion was given to charities in the

These giving opportunities have grown dramatically, both nationally and at the Depot Foundation, accounting for approximately 10% of our total gifts.
